Common, clear rules for eFTI platforms

Regulation

- eFTI Regulation enables electronic sharing of freight regulatory information across the EU
- Authorities must accept data submitted through certified eFTI platforms
- Common rules ensure trust, interoperability, and security
- Focus on business-to-administration (legal scope) → Impact on businessto-business (implementation)













eFTI platforms - the legal building blocks

- eFTI data specifications (common data set and subsets)
- Implementing Regulation (EU) 2025/xxxx
 - functional and technical specifications for the eFTI platforms
- Delegated Regulation (EU) 2026/xxxx
 - rules for the certification of the eFTI platforms











Implementing Regulation 2025/xxx detailed requirements for eFTI platforms



- Main underlying principles
 - √ Flexible architecture implementation
 - ✓ Mandatory functionalities for operations by business user
 - ✓ Mandatory requirements for authorized, secure and transparent access








eFTI platforms requirements - Secure connections and interoperability



- Platforms connect machineto-machine with eFTI Gates
- Communication via secure, authenticated channels
- May integrate existing ERP/logistics systems ("tributary ICT systems")
- Ensures flexibility and reuse of existing IT solutions





eFTI platforms requirements - Access and user rights management

Regulation


- Authorisation via dedicated registry of processing rights
- Business users identified and authenticated via eIDAS-compliant electronic IDs
 - Minimum assurance level 'advanced' (not 'QES')
- Access logs ensure traceability and auditability
- Temporary access possible for occasional business users
 - Two-factor authentication required





The eFTI Consignment Movement Data Set (CMDS)





One dataset per consignment per transport movement


Commission

- Template generated automatically from relevant eFTI data subsets (=applicable legal requirements)
- Common structure (eFTI common data set) ensures interoperability and machine readability
- Enables flexible compliance with different regulatory requirements while economic
 operators/business users share data only once

eFTI platforms requirements - Data processing by business users



- Create a consignment dataset
- Edit or update information
- Read / download copies
 - human + machine-readable
- Sign electronically
 - consignor, carrier, consignee
- Apply combined-transport "stamp"
- Download UIL/QR code
- Archive datasets





Security, privacy, and transparency



- Platforms are required to implement cybersecurity measures
- Access by authorities is based on coded authorized requests & logged and notified in real time to business users
- Data must be stored on locations falling under EU jurisdiction
- → Build confidence to share data digitally





What comes next



2025

Oct - Nov: Implementing Regulation on eFTI platforms specifications (adoption, publication)

Nov - Dec: Technical guidance and artefacts v.1.0 (wiki format)

2026

- Q1 2026: Certification rules for eFTI platforms (delegated regulation)
- Q2 2026: Specifications and certification rules for service providers (implementing & delegated regulations)
- Q4 2026: Business use cases handbook (Digital Transport and Logistics Forum /DTLF)

2027+

- 2026 2028: eFTI4EU, eFTI4ALL, eFTI4LIVE pilot testing and implementation support
- July 2027: go live
- 2027 2029: business large scale deployment
